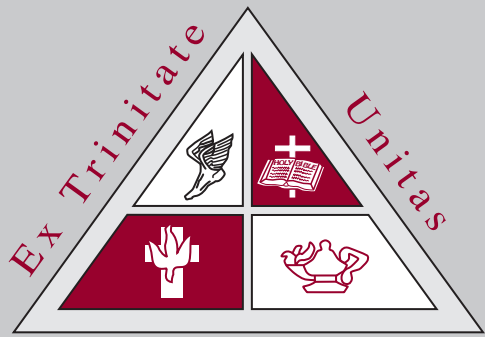
SERVICE Whether at hospitals, parishes, elementary schools, care facilities, etc., Trinity **students can be found giving back to their communities through Christian Service**.
